## **ACRA Preschool Program**

#### For children age three (must be potty-trained) through entering Kindergarten

This dynamic program uses group activities, games, water play, dress up, crafts and music to get children involved and connected. Every day children get a snack and time to play outside. Each week the Book Club brings some of our teens and parents in to share their favorite books with the kids, visitors from the community share their talents and interests, and there are field trips to nearby fun locations.

#### For children who are entering first grade through entering eighth grade (or age 14)

The ACRA Core program offers a variety of activities such as nature walks, arts and crafts, music, cooking, games, sports, playground games and special trips. Getting to know our neighbors is a big part of the program, and many talented visitors are invited to lead activities. #### What is ACRA?

The Arden Community Recreation Association, founded in 1948, provides recreational, educational and social activities throughout the year to residents of the three Ardens. ACRA unites the three communities of Arden, Ardentown and Ardencroft. Our mission is to build community within our villages. ACRA is for all ages and transcends class, race, religion and family circumstances in its welcome to events and programming. The goal of our summer program is to create an environment in which our children can play, work and learn together, and in which the involvement of community volunteers is an intrinsic part. ## How to Sign Up

Please review **Program Policies** below for eligibility requirements. Registration forms will be available on the first day of camp. If you wish to sign up in advance, please contact Terri Hansen at 475-7427

#### Children must be registered to attend.

A separate form including a parent's/guardian's signature must be completed for each child. A snack fee of \$15/child or \$30/family is requested. If you prefer to bring a snack for 70+ kids one day, contact the Program Director when the program begins. To cover the costs of field trips and special in-camp activities, an activity fee of \$25/child is requested. Scholarships are available.

#### **ACRA Code of Conduct**

For the safety and enjoyment of all campers, ACRA has established a Code of Conduct to help children realize that they are responsible for their own actions. ACRA expects staff and campers to honor its core values of respect, responsibility, caring and honesty.

- Show kindness and consideration toward others.
- Present a good role model to younger community members.
- > Play safely and think before acting.
- > Respect other's property and personal space.
- > Solve problems peacefully. Use words not actions.
- If a solution isn't reached, report the problem to summer program staff.



## **Summer Program Policies**

- 1. ACRA Summer Program attendance is limited to:
  - Resident children of the three Ardens
  - Children of staff
  - A limited number of spaces are available for grandchildren of residents on a first-come firstserved basis. Please register early to assure your child a space. For registration materials call Toby Ridings 475-4253.
  - Out-of-town children staying with an Ardens resident for two or more consecutive nights may attend ACRA while visiting, space permitting. Donation suggested.
- 2. All attending children must have a registration form signed by their parent or guardian. All non-resident grandchildren and out-of-town guests must have a special registration form signed by both the parent/guardian and the resident host. Please see the Program Director for a form.
- 3. Families are asked to provide three (3) hours of volunteer service to the program.
- 4. All children must remain at the program on any day they attend unless the parent picks them up or the parent has a *Permission to Leave Program* form on file with the Program Director.
- 5. Corporal punishment is against ACRA policy. This applies to staff, teen aides, playground monitors and volunteers.
- The Preschool program is for children who are potty trained, and age three up to entering kindergarten in September. The Preschool director may determine that a child is not ready for ACRA.
- 7. The Core program is open to children entering 1<sup>st</sup> through entering 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Inappropriate behavior may be, at staff recommendation, cause for the board to suspend privileges.
- 8. The summer program is free to all participants. Some special activities may require a small fee.
- Electronic games and cell phones are not permitted to be used at the ACRA Summer Program. Please note: There is no secure place to store personal belongings.
